July 17: Celebrate 68 years of bossa nova with an evening of live music at Dovetail Pizza (1816 S. First St.), where Austin favorite Paula Maya takes the stage with Bossa Nova Plus. Enjoy Maya's warm vocals and performance starting at 7 p.m.; all ages are welcome.

July 19: Antone's turns 51 with a special album release concert from Tejano legend Ruben Ramos, joined by Carrie Rodriguez, Grammy-winning conjunto favorites Los Texmaniacs, and more. This 21+ noche brings together Texas artists spanning across Tejano, conjunto and Americana. Doors open at 6 p.m.; show starts at 7 p.m. Tickets start at \$33.

July 22: Grupo Frontera brings its “Triste Pero Bien C*brón” Tour to Moody Center at 8 p.m. for a night of norteño, cumbia and música mexicana that has made the Texas-born group a global sensation. Tickets start at \$51.30.

July 25: Norteño icon Ramón Ayala returns to Austin with his “Historia De Un Final” Tour, celebrating a career that helped define generations of music. Don't miss this chance to honor one of the most iconic voices as he brings decades of beloved classics to the Moody Center as part of his farewell tour! Tickets start at \$72.15.

RANCHO ALEGRE CONJUNTO FESTIVAL

For more than a decade, the Rancho Alegre Conjunto Music Festival has celebrated the legacy of conjunto music while connecting Austin audiences with legendary performers from across Texas.

From July 10-12, this free, familia-friendly festival returns to Doris Miller Auditorium (2300 Rosewood Ave.) for its 11th año with live música featuring artists including headliners Rene Joslin y Los Favoritos, Los Enmascarados, and Gilberto Perez Jr. y Sus Compadres.
